Muḥammad's Genealogy in Jewish and Muslim Sources

The official biography of Muhammad called *al-Sīra al-Nabawiyya* begins with a genealogy that connects the Prophet directly to Ishmael and through Ishmael to Abraham and Adam. Because Muhammad was a member of the Hijazi tribe of Quraysh, the genealogy effectively connects all the Arabs in the region of Mecca to the biblical narrative. Muhammad's prophethood is thus not only spiritually consistent with biblical prophecy, according to Islamic belief it is also historically and even genetically consistent.
